NARRATIVE

On 05/22/2022 at 0515 hrs. I, Ofc. Hall as dispatched to 4025 Watson Blvd. Suit 100 Clyde Armory in reference to a alarm. Prior to my arrival Ofc. Scuderi and Ofc. Broussard arrived on scene and found that the one of the front windows had been broken and called for Code 1 traffic to clear the building.

I arrived on scene and Ofc. Scuderi advised that Ofc. Broussard was still inside the building and there were no suspects inside. While walking around the building we located a tag for a firearm just north of the building. Sgt Allen arrived on scene and was briefed of the situation. Sgt Allen requested a track be started until the key holder arrived on scene.

While waiting on the key holder Dispatch sent out a call advising that someone had called in and stated they saw someone hiding a rifle at the Comfort inn at 3010 Watson Blvd. All Squad 1 units then left for that location. Officers at the Comfort Inn took three juveniles into custody and transported them to Warner Robins Police Department were they were able to recover five of the stolen firearms.

While I provided scene security at 4025 Watson Blvd. Scott Fortenberry arrived on scene and unlocked the building. I then had Mr. Fortenberry complete a crime scene processing waiver. I provided Mr. Fortenberry with a case number and advised him on how to obtain a copy of this report. While on scene at 4025 Watson Blvd. Mr. Fortenberry was able to provide the serial numbers for all stolen firearms. Mr. Fortenberry advised that the total for all six firearms taken was \$10,599.70. While providing scene security five of the six stolen rifles were recovered. The rifle that was not recovered was placed into NCIC/GCIC as stolen.

At 0647 hrs. IDC Tech Herrera arrived on scene and I began to provide scene security until he released the scene at 1016 hrs. While on scene Mr. Fortenberry was unable to provide me with a copy of the security footage and was advised that when he was able to contact Warner Robins Police Department. The crime scene processing waiver was turned into Warner Robins Police Department to be logged.

Around 1040 hrs. Ofc. Lowry was able to take the last suspect into custody and transported Calvin Jackson to the Warner Robins Police Department. After speaking with police. Around 1345 hrs. Sgt Gray located the final firearm in the area of Outback Steak House 3088 Watson Blvd. Det. DelGiorno took possession of the firearm. The rifle was removed from NCIC as stolen.

On 05/22/2022 while in the area of a commercial burglary at 4025 Watson Blvd (Clyde Armory) I, Ofc Taylor, responded to 3101 Watson Blvd (Comfort Suites) in reference to a subject that had called 911 to report he observed a young black male subject hide a gun on the side of the building.

Upon officers arrival we made contact with 3 young black male subjects that were sitting on a retaining wall near the side of the building. While speaking with the subjects I stepped over the retaining wall that the subjects were sitting on. When I stepped over the wall I observed a book bag that was partially in a storm drain behind the subjects. The book bag had 2 AR style rifles clearly sticking out of it. Those three subjects were then detained. After securing the subjects in police vehicles I made contact with the witness by phone.

The witness, Russell Hale, stated that he observed a black male wearing black shorts, and a black shirt walk to the west side of Comfort Suites and hide a gun. He estimated the subject to be in his late teens to early 20's. He further stated that after hiding the gun the subject met up with 3 other young black males in the parking lot of the hotel. Officers then checked that area of the hotel and were able to recover another AR style rifle.

There is no further information at this time.

On this date I, Det. Dokes, was scheduled as the on call detective for the Warner Robins Police Department. At approximately 0550 hrs., I was contacted by Sgt. Allen and advised of a commercial burglary at Clyde Armory. During the initial call, Sgt. Allen informed me that 3 males had been detained and a they believed some of the firearms had been recovered as well. He requested I make contact with him at Clyde Armory, 4025 Watson Blvd, to get a complete briefing and assist in the case.

While responding to the scene, I noticed multiple officers located at the Comfort Inn Suites, 3101 Watson Boulevard. I stopped by this location to see if Sgt. Allen was in this area, due to the amount of officers on scene. During this time, I made contact with Ofc. Taylor. Ofc. Taylor informed me that offices responded to this area due to a concerned citizen making a 911 call. He advised the caller informed dispatch of males with rifles being in the parking lot and also hiding a rifle in the area. He informed me when officers arrived on scene, they noticed three black males sitting on a retaining wall in front of this business. He stated once contact was made, officers observed a book bag sitting in a drain just on the other side of the wall. He advised in the book bag they noticed two AR style firearms. At this time, the males were placed into custody by the officers and the firearms were secured. He informed me a search of the area, based on the concerned citizen report, offices located another firearm in the area as well.

After speaking with Ofc. Taylor, I responded to the incident location. While on scene at that location, Sgt. Allen arrived. He advised me while watching the video, they discovered 4 individuals to be involved in the burglary. He stated in the video he observed the males making entry into the business and taken multiple firearms from the business. He told me he had also viewed the security footage from Comfort Suites that showed the males with the back packs wearing different clothes and no face coverings. We then responded into the business and reviewed the footage. In the footage, I was able to observe the 4 individuals breaking into the business. I was able to count a total of 6 AR style firearms being removed from the business by the 4 offenders. Once the firearms were obtained the offenders left the area on foot. I was able to take some images of the video to see if I could compare any of the clothing items to the males that were detained by patrol.

After reviewing the video footage, I responded back to Comfort Suites to view the security footage at that business. While on scene, the video system froze, so the video footage could not be viewed. The employees reached out to the owner and advised them of the issues. The owner informed the employees they would have to respond due to the security system being in the office, which was locked. With the owner having to respond, I decided to

respond to the station to interview the detained males.

Before getting to the Warner Robins Police Department, I overheard radio traffic advising a search/K9 track yielded in the discovery of other firearms and articles of clothing. I was advised the clothing items matched items viewed in the video from Clyde Armory along with the style firearms that were recovered.

Once at the station, I spoke with the three juveniles that where detained at the station. These males were advised he would like his mother to be on scene for the interview, so he was not questioned about the incident. Below are summary interviews with and For the entirety of the interview, see audio/video attached to this report. All juveniles were read their rights and completed Advisement Form prior to the interview being completed.

\*\*\*\*\*Interview Summary \*\*\*\*\*

After reading his rights and completing the Advisement Form, I began the interview by asking him his mother's name, his name and address. I then started asking questions about the burglary. I asked who was with him and he stated and another individual that he did not know. I asked him what type of vehicle they were in and he advised they were dropped off at the movies. He informed me that they got the ride from a random person around 1100-1200 hours. I then asked him where they made contact with the 4th individual and he stated they meet him at the movies. He described this male as being a tall white male. He informed me he had just meet the 4th individual that night as well. I asked him if they had made the plans to break into the gun store at the movies and he advised the white male peer pressured them into breaking in the gun store. I asked how the white male peer pressured them into breaking in the store. He then advised me he had to remember what he said to make them complete the burglary. He later advised he forgot what the male had said to pressure them into breaking in the business. I asked him again what the male said and he advised the male stated, "on boss if you dont break the window he going to shoot you". I then asked did he say, " if you don't break the window, I am going to shoot you" and he responded by shaking his head up and down, which is recognized as "yes". I asked if the male had a gun and he stated he did not have a gun. He informed he believed the male did have a fire arm. He stated that he was not scared of getting shot, but he did not want to get shot. I asked where the white male went and he advised he walked off when officers came to the area. I asked what they did with the firearms and he advised he tossed the firearm he took into the wooded area. He informed me he remebered the area he left the firearm he had and could take officers to the firearm as well. I then asked why he tossed his firearm in the woods. He stated he tossed his firearm because he had other friends that did the same thing and "I did not want to end up like them". I asked what other burglaries they may have been involved in and he stated this was the only burglary he was part of. I then asked what he was wearing during the burglary and he provided a description of his clothing. I showed him and image from the security footage and pointed at a male wearing the clothing he described and he advised that was him. I asked him who went in the store and he advised he was one of the males that went into the business. He advised

he passed a rifle out the window and he was the last person to exit the business. I also asked he would ride with the officer to locate the any firearms that may not have been discovered.

After the interview, he was transported to the area he placed the firearm he was in possession of. Patrol informed me there was no rifle in that area, but it was an area a rifle was located earlier.

\*\*\*\*\*Interview summary\*\*\*\*\*

The interview with started by me advising him of his rights. I then began interviewing about getting information on where he stayed and his mothers information. I then asked what happened. He stated they got dropped off by a person named "Jet". He said this male dropped him off at Kroger on Watson. He said in that area they made contact with a "white boy", who brought up the idea of breaking into the gun store. He informed me that he said "no" when the idea was introduced, but eventually admitted the "white boy" broke into the business and took the firearms. then advised he was going to tell the truth, but he did not want me to tell anyone else that he told me the truth. He said I could tell the other people and I believed he was speaking about the other juveniles that were arrested. He then advised the "white boys" nickname was "Draco". He then said "Draco" went into the business and grabbed the "stick". He said "Draco" peer pressured into going into the business as well. He said told "Draco" "No" and I asked him where they were during this time. He said they were in the area of the Mall during this time. He then advised him, did not want to commit the burglary, but "Draco" told them they were going to "do it". He then described what occurred during the burglary. He said they eventually broke into the store by busting the window. He advised they all grabbed guns and ran done the road, eventually taking a "cut". He said they stopped by a hotel to grab something to drink. He advised a lady must have saw the "stick" gun on the camera. He advised that was when they sat down and waited on the police, because they did not want to get in trouble. He informed me the "white boy" took off running around this time. I then asked if he knew how many firearms they took. He stated he believed it was around 5-6 firearms that were taken. I asked if this was the first time and he said this was their first time. I then asked him if they had ever broken into another business, that had recently been broken into. He advised they had not gone into that business, but spoke about the business having bars on the windows that he could fit through. With him making this statement, it made me believed they had at least tried or talked about committing a burglary there as well. I advised him that I had not seen the videos from that business, but was advised they showed similarities with th male from that video. I then asked him about when they made contact with "Draco". He advised the "white boy" was with them at the VP store and rode with them to the Mall area. I then showed images from the security footage and he helped me identify each person in the footage. I asked more question about who "Draco" was and where he lived. advised "Draco" was also homeless, from his understanding. then spoke about the incident one more time and advised me of the events that occurred up to when officers made contact. Around this time, noticed notes i had written on my paper for another incident. He questioned why I had the letters "GD", which are short for "gangster disciples". With him making a reference to this note, I asked him if he claimed any specific gang. He stated he did not claim, but a family member of his was "GD" and

After speaking with the mother of I spoke with patrol officers. I advised them of a description of the last male observed on video associated with this incident. This despotisms was provided due to a shift change and officers just arriving at work. Shortly after providing the BOLO, a patrol officers observed a male walking in the Elberta Road area that matched the suspect description. The male ran immediately upon sight of the officers. A short foot pursuit was conducted and the male was placed into custody. The male was then transported to the station.

Once at the station, the male provided me with his name as being Mr. Calvin Jackson. Mr. Jackson refused to speak with me about the incident, so I placed him back into the holding cell. While placing Mr. Jackson in the holding cell, he advised he would like to show me where he stashed the last firearm that was not recovered. On May 22, 2022, at approximately 0507 hrs, I, Ofc Broussard, was dispatched to Clyde Armory at 4025 Watson Blvd in reference to an alarm. Officer Scuderi arrived on scene a few seconds before me and advised that there was forced entry to the front of the business. When I arrived on scene, I observed damaged to the front door, but entry could not have been made through there. On the large window near the door, there was damage to it with an opening large enough for a person to enter. I entered through the opening to ensure that there were no unwanted persons still inside. I had Ofc Scuderi cover me from the outside due to the precarious opening, glass shards, and the difficult way that you had to enter. I cleared the business and had negative contact with anybody inside.

In the business on the other side of the window, there were items on a shelf that had been knocked over. On the wall by the window, there were metal hangers and one rifle. The rest of the business appeared to be stocked and this was the only area where there were empty hangers/display areas. I advised other units that the suspect(s) were likely in possession of rifles.

The front door was locked with a key lock on both sides. I stood by inside the business until the owner arrived to unlock the door. Once he arrived, we went into the office to try to review the surveillance footage. While the owner, Sgt. Allen, and I were attempting to review the surveillance footage, Dispatch advised that there were subjects at the Comfort Inn and Suites that stashed a rifle at the side of the building. Officers arrived on scene, made contact with three black males, and detained them. I stood by until they were detained and then made contact with the clerk inside.

I advised her that there was an incident nearby and I requested to review the video surveillance footage. She contacted the manager and got the password for the system. While she was trying to get the password, she informed me that the subjects that the officers were out with came inside, said that they had been playing basketball, and asked for water. There was a white male that was with them, but she could not provide much of a description. I started reviewing the footage and got to the point where the suspects that officers were out with were approaching the business. Sgt. Allen arrived on scene at the hotel at that time. The surveillance footage was turned over to him so that I could try to locate the rifles.

I then started searching the area between the Comfort Inn and Clyde`s Armory for the rifles and suspects. One rifle was located on the northwest corner of the building. I continued searching the area and the businesses between the Comfort Inn and Clyde`s Armory. I was able to locate a black ski mask in the parking lot of Comfort Inn. It was at the southeast corner of the parking lot just before the roadway. Ofc Opitz responded with his K9 partner and conducted a scent track. Just south of that area, there is an "O" shaped roadway that continues to Osigian Blvd. Where the "O" shaped roadway is, there was a rifle located in the brush on the west side of it. The ski mask and the rifle were photographed and collected by Ofc Wojtal.

I continued searching the area until about 0715 hrs., but was unable to locate or recover any further evidence.

I, Det. Del Giorno, in performing in my duty of TFO with the ATF, responded to assist Det. Dokes with the investigation of the burglary of Clyde's Armory. I responded to headquarters and went along Det. Dokes to 1204 Elberta Rd., the apartments, the residence of XXX. We requested consent to search the apartment and was granted it by XXX. We located a box of black nitrile gloves similar to those used by the suspects. We were granted consent to the storage shed in the rear of the apartment and see a lawn chair and bedding as if someone was sleeping there. Ms. XXX advised that a white male had been sleeping in the storage room similar to the one described as Draco by XXX. We also learned that he goes by Calvin.

I received footage from Clyde's Armory and 3101 Watson Blvd., Comfort Suites.

We disseminated the surveillance footage of Calvin to Patrol. A short time later Ofc. Optiz was traveling on Carl Vinson Pkwy. and observed a male matching the physical description and clothing description of Calvin. He was apprehended by Ofc. Lowry with assistance from Centerville Police Department. He was transported to headquarters after he was identified as Calvin JACKSON.

Det. Dokes interviewed JACKSON who advised that he will take officers to the last weapon. He rode with Sgt. Gray in the back of his patrol vehicle. He directed him to Outback Steakhouse and to a row of bushes along the rear of the business. Det. Dokes and I located the weapon within the bushes. This was captured on body cam. The weapon was confirmed to be the last unrecovered weapon and was entered into property.

On Monday, May 23, 2022, I, Cpl. J. Johnson, assisted Deputy Harmon with a combative inmate, \_\_\_\_\_, in the hallway near the Juvenile Office court rooms/employee restrooms.

Upon my arrival in the hallway, I saw Deputy Harmon, Court bailiff- Jim George, Sgt. Andrews, Sgt. Lashley, and Sgt. Harper, trying to gain control of \_\_\_\_\_ who was actively fighting them. Once \_\_\_\_\_ was secured, Deputy Harmon, Sgt. Harper, and Cpl. Moss picked \_\_\_\_\_ up from the floor and carried him into juvenile holding cell 4 after he refused to walk on his own. \_\_\_\_\_ kept saying he wanted his mother and was upset because Judge Wilburn ordered him to return to Cadwell RYDC. Once inside of cell 4, \_\_\_\_\_ kept telling us that he wasn't going back to RYDC and warned us that we would have to fight him. As we attempted to secure \_\_\_\_\_ legs onto the locking mechanism on the concrete bench, \_\_\_\_\_ became combative and refused to allow us to secure his legs. Sgt. Harper, Cpl. Moss, and Deputy Harmon held \_\_\_\_\_ down and secured his legs. \_\_\_\_\_ then tried to hit his head on the wall, so Cpl. Moss and I held him down while Sgt. Harper attempted to place the red padded helmet onto head. The padded helmet was too small so Sgt. Harper took my position on \_\_\_\_\_ (held him down to prevent him from causing self-harm) while I assisted Deputy Harmon with moving vehicles so that \_\_\_\_\_ could be transported to Cadwell RYDC. Once we had the transport vehicle parked in the sally-port area, I walked back inside of cell 4 and told Sgt. Harper we were ready for transport. \_\_\_\_\_ refused to get inside of Deputy Harmon's patrol vehicle, so Sgt. Harper and I had to physically pick \_\_\_\_\_ up and put him inside of the rear passenger area. \_\_\_\_\_ refused to sit down on the rear seat and had to be forced inside (we had to physically bend his legs to close the passenger side door and pushed his upper body up to close the driver side door). When we finally closed both rear doors, \_\_\_\_\_ started hitting his head on the plexiglass section of the patrol vehicle cage/divider. Sgt. Harper and I opened the rear doors and verified that \_\_\_\_\_ sustained no injuries.

Cpl. Moss, Sgt. Andrews, and Sgt. Harper talked to \_\_\_\_\_ and were able to calm him down. Once calm, Deputy Harmon and I transported \_\_\_\_\_ to Cadwell RYDC. No further incidents occurred and \_\_\_\_\_ was released to Cadwell RYDC staff.

On 05/23/2022, I, Cpl. Adrian Moss, while working within the Houston County Juvenile Office, overheard someone in the hallway screaming "Fight! I have a FIGHT back here!"

I left my desk and ran into the hallway where I heard multiple deputies yelling lawful commands to "Stop Resisting" and "Place your hands behind your back". I ran around the corner and saw Houston County Juvenile Court Bailiff, Jim George, on the floor with the juvenile suspect, Mr. George was trying to obtain control of , who was in leg irons (restraints) but not in handcuffs. was actively resisting Mr. George, and at that point Sgt. B. Lashley, Sgt. K. Harper, and Sgt. G. Andrews.

I was able to maintain control of legs, as he started to kick his feet while in leg irons. I heard one of the Deputies state "I got him in cuffs" (not sure which one). Once was secured in handcuffs that were behind his back, he still continued to resist while restrained. He was asked multiple times to stop fighting and we could walk him back to the holding cells. screamed at us and stated multiple times "Fuck You! I wanna see that Judge!" We again asked him to calm down and walk with us to the cell, he continued to resist and scream "Fuck You!" At this time, I grabbed his feet while the other Deputies grabbed his arms and upper torso. We then carried him back to Juvenile Cell #4.

Once inside the cell, continued to resist and began flailing his legs and upper body around. He then attempted to hit his own head against the brick walls. We were able to sit him on the bench, attach his leg iron chain to a restraint bolt in the bench. When attempted to hit his head on the brick wall, Sgt. Harper and I held his body against the wall to prevent him from gaining any leverage to harm himself. Sgt. Harper was handed a red padded helmet to keep head safe from injury; however, the foam helmet was too small. At that time, was just held against the wall (with no pressure on his chest, neck, airways or arteries) to keep him safe until we could arrange a safe transport to the Cadwell County RYDC. At this time, stopped resisting and began to relax. When he did, Sgt. Harper and I released him, allowing him to sit on the bench, off the wall. Sgt. Harper and I remained in the cell until it was time to move him to the transport vehicle.

Once the transport truck was ready, Sgt. Harper and I asked if he was going to walk to the transport truck with us. stated "I ain't going Bruh!" We informed that there was no other option other than the RYDC. again stated "I ain't going Bruh, I wanna talk to that Judge again." We informed him that was not going to happen. then stated "Y'all just gonna have to fight me." When informed that the transport truck was ready, was unlocked from the restraint bolt on the bench, and I observed his body stiffen up as he continued to actively resist.

was carried out to the transport truck as he continued to resist while restrained. Once inside the truck, he attempted to slam his head into the plexiglass separator between the back seat and the front seats. I observed that the plexiglass separator would move with head, which ensured that he did not get injured. did not hit anything hard inside the truck with his head. Once attempted to hit his own head, Sgt.

On Monday, May 23, 2022, I was working in my office at the Houston County Juvenile Division when Sgt. Gary Andrews' shout out there was a fight in the hallway. I quickly responded around the corner and observed a physical altercation between a large black male juvenile, Deputy Harmon, and Juvenile Court bailiff, Jim George.

The juvenile was in the prone position with his arms underneath his body. The juvenile was aggressively resisting being handcuffed. As Sgt. Harper and Cpl. Moss were responding right behind me, I took up position on the juveniles' back to assist with placing the juvenile into handcuffs. As the Juvenile continued to struggle and resist, the responding officers were able to get the juvenile to the holding cell.

While in the holding cell, a plan was put into motion to get the detention van and move to the defiant juvenile to his assigned youth detention center. The Juvenile keep resisting and struggling to break free, while telling the other officers, he was not going back to the YDC.

The juvenile was eventually escorted to Deputy Harmon's vehicle for transportation. As the juvenile was being placed in the truck, he again, aggressively resisted being placed in the vehicle. The juvenile banged his head against the front and back window but did not appear to sustain any injuries during this action.

The juvenile was held in several different restraint positions to keep him from harming himself and others. The juvenile's status was monitored during the restraint period. After several minutes of struggling with deputies, Sgt. Harper and I were able to deescalate the situation and reposition him in the up-right seated position. The handcuffs that were originally behind the juveniles back, were relocated to the front. I administered water to the juvenile and assisted him in holding the bottle. I briefly made quick assessment on the juvenile's head and arms for any noticeable injuries, and none were observed. The juvenile was transported to the Regional Youth Detention Center in Cadwell for detainment.

On 05-23-22, while working in my office at the Juvenile Division, Sgt. Andrews notified us of a fight in the hall near the court room. As I went around the corner I saw Sgt. Lashley, Sgt. Andrews, Dep. Harmon, and a bailiff, Jim George, on the floor with an inmate. [redacted] Was actively fighting and trying to get away from them. Several of us were able to get him restrained and into a holding cell. The whole while he was fighting us.

Cpl. Moss and I held him down on the bench to keep him from trying to hurt us or himself. [redacted] calmed down for a little bit but was saying that he was not going in the van, and that he would die before he was locked up. Dep. Harmon got his truck parked in the sally port and we escorted [redacted] to the truck. He would not walk on his own so he was carried to the truck. He also fought us all while trying to get him in the truck. When we did get him contained he began to hit his head on the plastic cage partition but did not cause any visible injuries that I saw.

He was again restrained to keep him from hitting his head by Dep. Harmon. I also went to the other side of the truck and held him down, on his side, to relieve Dep. Harmon. [redacted] calmed down and stopped fighting with us after several minutes. I then moved his cuffs to in front of him and he assured me he was done fighting us. He was also given some water by Sgt. Lashley. Dep. Harmon and Cpl. Johnson then transported him to Cadwell RYDC. He was cooperative when they left.
